Nǐ hǎo. It is hard to believe we are in the last couple of weeks of school. We will be continuing our Mandarin instruction through the end of the year! Students did a great job earning miles to Beijing, China (Kindergarten and 1^{st}) and Hong Kong ($2^{nd}-5^{th}$) for great participation in World Language, in order to earn their Chinese Paìduì! Thank you to all of the parents who signed up and donated pre-packaged snacks for the students to use while learning how to use chopsticks! It was great fun trying to pick up M&M's, fruit snacks and more! A couple of classes still need to earn a few more miles, so if you haven't received a Sign-Up Genius link in your email yet, be looking for one soon! I really appreciate all of the support and help of the Adams parents!

You may be seeing some Mandarin learning coming home via backpacks, especially in Kindergarten through 2^{nd} grade (we even learned to write the characters for numbers!). Grades 3-5 don't bring as much home because they have "passports" (notebooks) in which they record their learning so that they can build on it each year and take it with them to middle school after 5^{th} grades. 5^{th} graders will bring their passports home at the end of the year so parents can see some of the things they learned!

Throughout this school year, I have been keeping track of student growth in language and culture. 2nd grade had a pre and post-test in Spanish, 3rd in French, 4th in German and 5th in Mandarin. I am so happy to report that over 90% of the students made growth in learning language and culture! Since we are learning a small amount of each of four languages, students will not reach fluency, but my sincere goal is that they would have a heart for the diverse people of the world, be more knowledgeable about other cultures, and enjoy learning and comparing languages! I believe that learning four languages, and about the cultures of the countries where those languages are spoken, will allow students to become better global citizens, as well as help them to develop a love for (at least) one of the languages so that they will be EXCITED to continue in middle school, high school, and beyond! Ask your child which language he or she enjoyed learning most, and which language they might continue in middle school!

ADAMS 5TH GRADE CULTURE CLUB



The Adams Culture Club is ending the year learning about the culture of poverty and homelessness in Midland County by visiting the Open Door, a homeless shelter in downtown Midland. The first weekend in June, we will be experiencing lunch outdoors, touring the Open Door facilities, and hearing a presentation about poverty from Director Renee Pettinger. Too often, people are afraid of, or unsure about, other cultures because of a lack of knowledge and experience with that culture. Through learning about poverty and homelessness, its causes, its effects, and how to help those struggling with a lack of resources, we hope to remove some of the stigma and fear. This learning and experience will help the students to be more confident when encountering someone who may be suffering from poverty or homelessness, and they will be less afraid to engage and help!

Poverty and homelessness are an even bigger issue now since the Covid-19 global pandemic, and awareness of the causes, and how to take action, are so important. We are all part of the Midland community, and we want to understand the diverse members of our county. That doesn't mean we must only learn about people with a different ethnicity, but also those with different religions, skin colors, socioeconomic status, abilities, and more. The 5th grade Culture Club has learned so much this year that will equip them to be better, more knowledgeable and inclusive leaders in their schools and communities.
