Schoolwide, students have been inspiring each other to find new ways to be inclusive in the music classroom. They have immersed themselves in thoughts of how people experience music in a variety of ways, not just with their ears. You can see it, create it, perform it, feel it, move to it, and hear it. Two of the musical experiences we have focused on are "feeling" and "seeing" through sign language in music. Students K-5 have been learning songs in sign language since January, and continue to practice and prepare for our first Virtual Concert to send to our families and teachers. While Mrs. Williams has loved every moment of teaching and practicing sign language in music, the thing she has loved most is listening to the kind and beautiful words the kids have used to describe what it means to them to make sure all of their peers feel included in music class. Along with our performance rehearsals, every week in February students are learning about the music and lives of influential African American musicians in celebration of Black History Month. So far, we have enjoyed the music of Ella Fitzgerald "The Queen of Jazz," and Duke Ellington.

# ADAMS 5TH GRADE CULTURE CLUB



On Saturday, January 30<sup>th</sup>, the Adams Elementary 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Culture Club met virtually to learn about race, identity, and what it means to be white and have white privilege (in honor of Martin Luther King Jr. Day and the upcoming Black History Month). Joining the meeting were special guests Connor Reed (graduate student) and Camryn McGee (college student),

founding members of Anti-Racist Midland, a local group of MPS graduates who advocate for anti-racist education and reforms for the Midland area. Connor and Camryn shared their experiences and encouraged the students to take action to ensure that people treat those of other races fairly at Adams and in our community, and asked them to never stand idly by if they witness racism in practice.

Students had great discussion about equality and the work we still need to do in order to ensure that people of all races have the same opportunities and are treated with respect and dignity. They made connections to history they learned in class, and a book many recently read - <u>Blended</u>, by Sharon Draper. They even had a chance to meet author Sharon Draper through a virtual event organized by Mrs. Lipovsky and Mrs. Capua, funded through Donors Choose! One student ended the meeting by asking that the Slideshow be posted to the Culture Club Google Classroom so she could "savor it a little more." Mrs. Kim McMahan, Culture Club Director, is impressed by the student empathy, knowledge, and interest in taking action to end racism, starting in our own community. We will be the change!
