

Adams Teams Perform Admirably at FIRST Robotics!

Last Saturday was the Regional Competition for our fourth and fifth grade *FIRST Lego League Robotics* teams. Teams had to design and program a robot to carry out tasks, collaborate with teammates to research and propose a solution to a problem that cities face,

and present to judges.

The *Adams Ultimate Builders* applied what they learned last year and finished 6th in robot qualification, out of the 33 teams. Their Innovation Project, "Solving for Traffic Congestion," focused on various solutions for traffic congestion, including Smart Traffic Lights.





The Adams City Warriors had a great time at the qualifier and enjoyed sharing with the judges their Innovation Project "Using renewable materials to replace cement in concrete to reduce C02 emissions." The City Warriors won the Programming Award and qualified for the State Finals! The team heads down to Bloomfield Hills High School for the state finals tomorrow—good luck Adams City Warriors!

We still anticipate being in the new gym, cafeteria, and platform/stage beginning in January. NWEA Assessments

We completed our first week of NWEA testing this week. There were some technological glitches, which was not unexpected, but we solved those and we are looking forward to finishing the testing next week. As a reminder: this month, as part of an MPS-wide pilot program, we are assessing our students in Math and English using the NWEA MAP assessment. This is part of a pilot program for all Midland Public Schools elementary schools. If everything goes as expected, we may use this system next school year to replace several of the other assessments that we have given students (students will still take the M-STEP). Ideally these tests, which are given on the Chromebooks, will take less time, be more standardized, and give us more timely results than others we have used.

Since this is a pilot program, we will not be using or sharing the results; this is a chance for us to test the system and see how it works, and how helpful it is. If we decide to adopt the assessment long-term, sharing parent reports with student results will be a part of the program.
