Last week in gym class, we were lucky enough to have Coach Stadelmeier visit and teach us about the sport of Lacrosse. There are several "Try Lacrosse Free Days" coming up on the near future. Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grade students worked with jump ropes and learned that there are a lot of ways to jump rope that we are all capable of. Be sure to ask your child if they have any cool things they can do with a jump rope.

 3^{rd} , 4^{th} and 5^{th} grade students worked on jump rope skills for the past couple of weeks. Jump rope is a great activity for lifetime fitness. It is my hope that they have a few tricks they enjoy and they'll continue to challenge themselves with more tricks.

We're going to spend some time playing tennis in the next few weeks. The main goal in PE class is to help develop hand-eye coordination. Putting a racquet in your child's hand will force their brain to account for the longer reach of the racquet which will further develop the part of the brain responsible for eye-hand coordination. Not to mention it's going to be tons of fun and exercise. 4th and 5th grade students will have an opportunity to play in a Paddleton Tournament on Saturday February 22nd. Keep an eye out for permission slips to come home in early February.

Please help your students to have clean gym shoes when they come to gym class. Students whose shoes leave the gym floor dirty will not be allowed to participate and other types of shoes are slippery making participation too dangerous.
