
Winter Coats

World Language Update

WHAT'S UP IN WORLD LANGUAGE?

In World Language, we are completing our theme of the year, which is "Travel the World -Because not all classrooms have four walls." The entire school voted on where they would go if they could visit just ONE place in the world, and I revealed the top 13 destinations chosen by students and staff (we had several ties, so ended up with 13 countries). The top countries, from least chosen to the number one, are as follows:



We had a great time looking at a scratch off map on which I scratched all 67 countries chosen by our Adams' community. We could tell where most chosen countries were located (Europe) and where very few countries were chosen (Africa), and we had good discussion about why we thought some parts of the world were not as popular.

We will be learning which countries in the world speak the four languages we are learning, and during "español," we studied the 21 countries that speak Spanish, focusing on Hispanic Heritage Month and the students at Adams who have heritage from Spanish speaking countries. As we start French NEXT WEEK, I hope to open student minds to the African continent, where many French-speaking countries are located.

Students had a great time discovering and sampling some Mexican snacks as we watched "Kids Try Mexican Snacks." Many students loved the Paleta Payaso (chocolate covered marshmallow suckers) and Takis (spicy rolled tortilla snacks), but didn't like the chili covered Tamarind suckers. Opinions were mixed on the De la Rosa Mazapán, a crumbly peanut snack (which is my personal favorite). Those students who were absent for the fiesta are getting a chance to participate in a makeup flesta during their lunch recess this week. If they are absent for that, I will send home the snacks for them to sample at home on Friday. Thank you so much for your donations to our flesta that allowed the kids to experience some Mexican treats and learn a little about the culture.
