This week our 5<sup>th</sup> grade experienced a very cool event—a visit with renowned author Sharon Draper!






Mrs. Washabaugh's fourth graders reviewed the I Have a Dream speech, analyzed the topics covered, and created Found Poems highlighting important sections. The close reading and detailed discussions required in-depth critical thinking

skills, and the end products—the poems—were excellent!

#### **NWEA Testing Coming to a Close**

We are finishing up our Winter NWEA assessment session this week. Classes are testing in both Math and English; the purpose of this is assessment is to measure students' growth in those areas from September through now, and we'll test again in the spring to see how much students grow for the entire school year. At the end of next week teachers will send home a growth report that expresses how your child is doing, and how that compares to other students nation-wide. Especially given these Covid times, and the way last school year ended, this information is very valuable in helping us target learning areas for each and every student.
