

Picture Day: Monday, September 21

Adams Picture Day is *Monday, September 21*. This is for **both face-to-face AND Virtual Academy students.** These pictures are for your school picture collection, and will also be included the school yearbook. If your child attends face-to-face, teachers will escort their students to the Media Center for photos.

Important information for **Virtual Academy** students who want pictures taken:

- 1. Come to Adams between 11:00 a.m. 12:30 p.m., or 4:00 5:30 p.m.
- 2. Please wear a mask, and enter through the Main Entrance, and then go directly into the Media Center through the door on the right. Pictures will be taken in the Media Center.
- 3. Parents may wait outside, or in the front lobby, while the pictures are being taken.
- 4. Proofs and order forms arrive about a week after picture day. Parents will be notified when they are ready for pick-up in the lobby.

NWEA Testing

Next Wednesday we begin the NWEA Map Assessment for all students, grades K-5, Virtual Academy and face-to-face. We will give this assessment multiple times this school year to meet the benchmark assessment requirement from the state of Michigan. This is not a "high stakes" test for your child, as the purpose is to simply measure student skill, knowledge, and growth in English and Math. We will use the information we receive to help direct our instruction in those areas. The NWEA is a technology-based assessment and will be taken on the Chromebooks.

Morning Drop-Off and Afternoon Pick-Up

The beginning and end of the school day went well this week. Please continue to plan to have your children arrive no earlier than 8:20 a.m. At the end of the day, whether you are here to pick-up your children or they leave on their own, please continue to leave the school property promptly, in order to limit germ communication. Thank you for your continued cooperation in this area.

Parking Lot Protocols

When dropping off and picking up students in your car, please remember to pull your car all the way forward, along the curb, as directed, to allow traffic to keep moving as much as possible. Other important notes:

- 1. Students need to enter/exit vehicles on the PASSENGER SIDE, closest to the curb.
- 2. You may find it goes smoother if students have bags and materials with them in the car, rather than in the trunk. This will save time when students are exiting the car.
- 3. Please DO NOT park and get out of your car along the drop-off/pick up line at the curb. If you are parking and walking to the school, park in the lot. Thank you!

We are aware that it is sometimes difficult to make ends meet and to provide adequate nutrition for families. The Midland County Emergency Food Pantry Network supplies the **Backpack Buddy** program to help bridge this gap. The program distributes packages of food to elementary and preschool children in backpacks or plastic bags on Friday afternoons (or the last day of the school week) to provide meals and snacks for the weekend.
