The state of Michigan requires us to provide these assessments for 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students each spring, including this year. To help your child prepare to do their best, please do the following.

- 1. Have a good night's sleep.
- 2. Eat breakfast!
- 3. Chromebook preparation—completely turn it off the day before, and fully charge the Chromebook.
- 4. Bring headphones, Chromebook, water bottle, and something to read.

Teachers will give students more specific directions prior to their testing sessions.
