

Wow, what a first day of school! We are very proud of how well your children adjusted to all of the changes and new procedures we have in place. It has been a long time since everyone went home on March 13, and today was an exciting, new beginning. As with any new launch, there are details that we need to work out during this first week, but everyone is off to a great start.

School Forms to Sign and Return

With the return to school come new forms to sign and return. You'll see two forms come home with your child; please fill out, sign, and return them by Thursday. The forms are:

- **Personal Information Form**—It is important that we have the latest information from you regarding contact info and other key details. Please update, sign, and return.
- **COVID-19 Temperature Screening Notification Form**—You know that part of our process for admitting students to school this year is that their temperature must be below 100.4 F. With this form you acknowledge that temperatures will be taken as students enter school. The temperatures will not be recorded, simply scanned; anyone with a temperature of 100.4 or higher will be taken to the quarantine room and parents will be called to pick them up. Please sign and return the form.

Chromebooks and Chargers

When you account for all Adams students, both face-to-face and virtual, there are more students at Adams this school year than last. Most students already have their Chromebooks and chargers in hand. However, since our enrollment has gone up, we still have Chromebooks, and Chromebook chargers, on order with our Technology Department. As soon as they are delivered to Adams we will distribute them.

Canvas

Students in all grades are learning about Canvas, our learning management system, every day. This is a very important tool that will help students continue to learn both in class and at home. Please ask your child(ren) about Canvas, and have them show you what they know. If they are uncertain, that is ok—reassure them that they will learn how to use it quickly, and we will help them. It is important that all students become comfortable using Canvas soon. It is a helpful tool in face-to-face learning, and is critical to remote/distance learning.
